The University of Cumbria

- Is a relatively new university celebrated 10th Anniversary 2018
- But not a young institution was formed by the merger of a number of established institutions: Cumbria Institute of the Arts, St Martin's College and University of Central Lancashire's Cumbria sites,


Cumbria Institute of the Arts – established in October 1822 as the Society for the Encouragement of Fine Arts.

St Martin's College - first intake of students was in 1964; in the 1990s St Martin's took over management of Charlotte Mason College which was established as a teacher training school in 1891.

The PgCert Digital Health

- Is an Online Masters level programme, validated in 2018 and developed from previously taught modules in Digital Health.
- The programme is designed to support practitioners to plan, implement and evaluate a work based digital health innovation.
- Students studying the course will need to have an idea for a digital project to implement in their practice area.
- The project idea will become the focus for your coursework.



The <u>PgCert Digital Health</u> - Modules

Programme is studied via distance learning and comprises two modules.

HLLG7102 Digital Health: Use of Technology in Health and Care (20 credits)

aims to provide you with an in-depth and critical understanding of factors associated with using Digital Technology to support health and care practice.

HLLG7104 Digital Health: Work-based Project (40 credits)

aims to support and mentor you to devise a digital health project within your practice area; this culminates in a project report.



Why study at Master's level?

According to the **Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education** (2015):

- Focus on a particular aspect of a broader subject area in which the learner has prior knowledge or experience
- Focus on a particular field of study in greater depth than they have encountered during previous study or experience
- Learn how to conduct research relating to a particular field of study and undertake a research project on a topic within the area of interest
- Specialise or become more highly specialised in an area of employment or practice



Preparing for Postgraduate study

We offer a "Preparing for Postgraduate Study" programme, to support our students to be able to:

- Appreciate the difference between undergraduate and postgraduate study
- Understand the importance of a critical approach to thinking, reading and writing in all aspects of postgraduate study
- Access and critically evaluate high-quality information
- Plan and structure their writing effectively
- Adopt an effective and critical approach to their writing
- Reference sources accurately and systematically both in-text and in the reference list

On successful completion of this programme you will be awarded a Postgraduate Certificate Digital Health (60 credits at Level 7)

- You can opt to combine these credits towards a Postgraduate Diploma or Masters qualification.
